## **Introductory Statement**

This policy is to outline the correct school uniform and rules and regulations governing student appearance in Coláiste Iósaef Community College.

## **Rationale**

As a school, we set high standards for all students; this also applies to the general appearance of students and the wearing of the school uniform. The school uniform should be worn appropriately and with pride by all students.

The school should be regarded as a place of work and learning and the regard a student places on themselves should be modelled in how the uniform is worn and how they present themselves throughout the school day and on the way to and from school.

## **This policy sets out to address the following:**

- To ensure parents, students and staff are aware of the correct school uniform.
- To ensure a collaborative process involving the Parents' Association, School Staff, Student Council and Board of Management was used to recognise the voice of all our school community.
- To ensure that the all students present highest standard of personal appearance at all times.
- To ensure that the entire school community endeavour to maintain the highest standards in matters of dress code and personal appearance for all students in the school.
- To enable parents to help with these standards in matters of general appearance, dress, hairstyles and jewellery at all times during the school year.

## **Uniform Requirements**

- All students are obliged to wear the full school uniform during school hours, on the way to and from school, on school excursions, when representing the school and during state examinations unless otherwise stated.
- It is understandable that from time to time a student may come to school without the correct uniform due to unforeseen circumstances. In this case the student should bring a written note to school explaining the reason for not having the correct uniform.
- A note is valid for only a short period of time to allow the student to rectify any uniform issues.
- The school may provide students with a temporary loan of a school jumper, shirt, skirt or pants.



The following items constitute the official school uniform:

### **Official Crested School Jumper**

- The school crested jumper must be worn at all times by all students.
- The jumper should be maintained in good condition and free from rips and tears.

### **White School Shirt/Blouse**

- A white shirt must be worn tucked inside skirt or pants.

### **Black School Pants**

- School pants should be well maintained and free from rips and tears.
- Flares, tracksuit bottoms or denim jeans are not acceptable as alternatives to the school pants.
- Socks should be black or dark in colour

### **Blue Tartan School Skirt**

- The skirt must not be torn/ripped or cut at the seams.
- Pyjamas, track suit pants, leggings, etc. may not be worn under the school skirt.
- Socks/tights must be black or dark in colour.

### **School Jacket**

- Students are permitted to wear uniform approved jackets (has a school crest) and plain navy or black jackets on the way to school and leaving school.
- Jackets should be stored in the locker or in designated areas.
- Students are not permitted to wear jackets in the school building.
- Hooded sweatshirts, bright coloured jackets, etc. are not an acceptable alternative to the recognised jackets outlined above.

### **Shoes**

- Runners/Trainers are not permitted as school shoes.
- Flat black shoes or navy/brown deck shoes are recognised as appropriate school shoes.



## Jewellery

- Discreet jewellery can be worn. Students are allowed to wear earrings in the lobe of the ear only; these should be discrete stud earrings, a maximum of one in each ear lobe.
- Hooped or large earrings are not permitted for Health & Safety reasons.
- Students with nasal piercings may only wear one small nose stud.
- Hoops, drops or bars etc. are not permitted on piercings and must be removed before coming to school

## General Appearance

- Students are asked to present to school in a neat and tidy manner at all times and when representing the school outside of scheduled classes.
- Hair should be kept neat and tidy at all times and be tied back for practical classes – Art, Engineering, Construction, Home Economics, P.E. and Science for H&S reasons.
- Extreme (unnatural) hair colour is not permitted. Students presenting with inappropriate designs or colour will receive a sanction and are expected to return to school having addressed the issue. In extreme cases, a student may be sent home.
- Tattoos should be covered during the school day.
- Students will be asked to remove excessive make-up.
- Chewing gum is prohibited.
- Students should be encouraged to keep uniform clean and tidy.
- For educational and health & safety reasons, painted, gel and acrylic nails are not permitted.

## Physical Education Uniform

- All 1st, 2<sup>nd</sup>, 3rd & Transition Year students are required to have the full PE Uniform. This consists of the following:
  - ✓ O’Neills Tracksuit Bottoms (College Crested Aston or Cashel)
  - ✓ Polo Shirt ( Auckland College Crested)
  - ✓ Mourne Shorts (College Crested)
- A student is permitted to wear the **FULL** PE uniform only on the day they have a scheduled PE class or when instructed by a teacher (school excursion, match, etc.).
- Proper foot gear and appropriate dress must be worn for all sports. The school has a PE dress code.



## **Uniform Inspections and failure to comply with this policy**

- Class teachers and school management will carry out uniform inspections regularly.
- Failure to comply with the uniform policy will result in a sanction being issued and the students may be sent home to change.

If a student or parent/guardian has a concern or query regarding the uniform, a piercing or hair change that may put a student in conflict with the school rules. They should seek advice from the school before considering any further action.
